Trick 100 is a game where you have to outbid - or you cheat! To do this, you play a card face down and simply claim that it is higher than the card currently on display. Whoever's turn it is can believe it or not. But be careful, not only cheating is possible in this game, but also bluffing. If you are wrong you have to draw 3 cards. And nobody wants that, because whoever plays all the cards first wins.

Game preparation:

Shuffle all 110 cards and then deal out 7 cards to each player. Place the remaining cards face down in the middle of the table as a draw pile. The top card is now revealed and placed next to the draw pile, this is the discard.

Gameplay:

You play in turns. When it's your turn, you have the following options:

1. Play 100: The 100 can be played on any card of the discard. And any card can be played on the 100, so it is a joker.

2. Outbid: When playing a card, you must make sure that the numerical value is higher than the one currently on display **and** that one of the two numbers/colors matches the discard (see example on the next page).



The 05 is lower than the 06 and may not be played. Although 12 is higher, it does not share a number/color with 06.

3. Pass: If you can't outbid the discard, you can pass, but you have to draw a card from the draw pile and you can't discard it straight away, even if it would fit. If everyone in a round passes, the game restarts, so the next player can discard any card.

4. Cheating: You place a card face down **next to** the discard. Who takes turns after you can either **continue playing with the discard** (1., 2. or 3.), or **challenge it and reveal your card**. If your card was revealed and it didn't outbid the discard, then you must draw 3 cards. If your card outbid the discard, the person who challenged draws 3 cards. A 100 may not be played face down.

If you have challenged, it is your turn. Restart the discard with playing any card you want.

Important: You may not cheat one after the other. If someone has played a card face down, the next player has to decide whether to continue playing or challenge it.

End of the game:

Whoever gets rid of their cards first wins the game. If you cheated on your last card and have to draw 3 cards, the game of course continues.
